



# Draft fact sheets – heat pump water heaters

15 September 2023

#### 1 We are seeking feedback

We are inviting submissions on a change to a requirement for the Home Energy Efficiency Retrofits (**HEER**) method that involves giving customers a heat pump water heater fact sheet prior to implementation. We are also seeking feedback on a proposal to require that a heat pump water heater fact sheet be given to business customers for the Installation of High Efficiency Appliances for Business (**IHEAB**) method. The requirements relate to:

- · Activity Definitions D17 and D19 under the HEER method and
- Activity Definitions F16 and F17 under the IHEAB method.

# 2 Why we prepared the fact sheets

Heat pump water heater technology isn't well understood by consumers. While there is a lot of information available, some consumers are not aware of potential issues relating to sizing, noise and cold air when the heat pump is installed. This has led to customer complaints that installations are not fit for purpose or don't consider the best solution for the customer (see ESS Notice 01/2023 – Concerns about installation of heat pump water heaters for more details).

Some of these complaints could be avoided by providing customers with relevant information to help them make informed decisions before the implementation takes place.

### 3 Our proposed approach

We intend requiring that a heat pump water heater fact sheet is provided to consumers before implementation for both the HEER and IHEAB methods. For installations under the HEER method the HEER heat pump fact sheet would replace the existing HEER Fact Sheet for heat pump water heater installations only (that is, for other installations under the HEER method you would still be required to provide customers with the existing HEER Fact Sheet).

The fact sheet will need to be given to customers before they agree to install a heat pump water system to help ensure they can make an informed decision.
